





People of all ages can find something in his life to provide them with guidance in their various fields of activity. The Holy Qur'an clearly mentions this aspect of his life, "Indeed in the Messenger of Allah (Muhammad مُوَالِمُواكِدُ ) you have a good example to follow for him who hopes for (the Meeting with) Allah and the Last Day, and remembers Allah much. 
